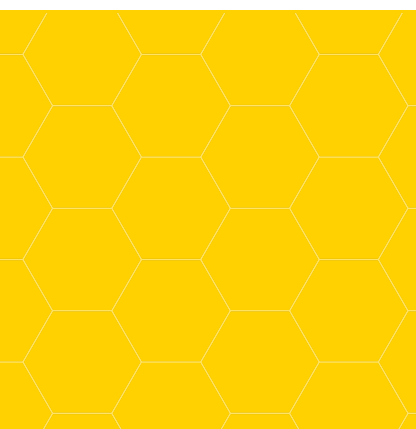
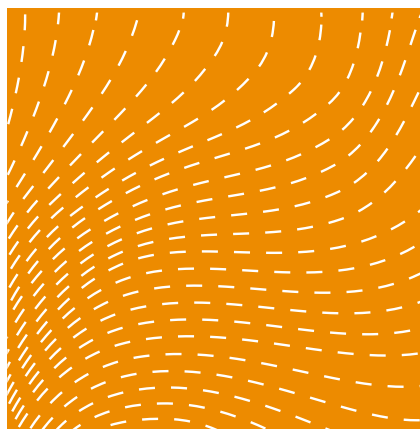

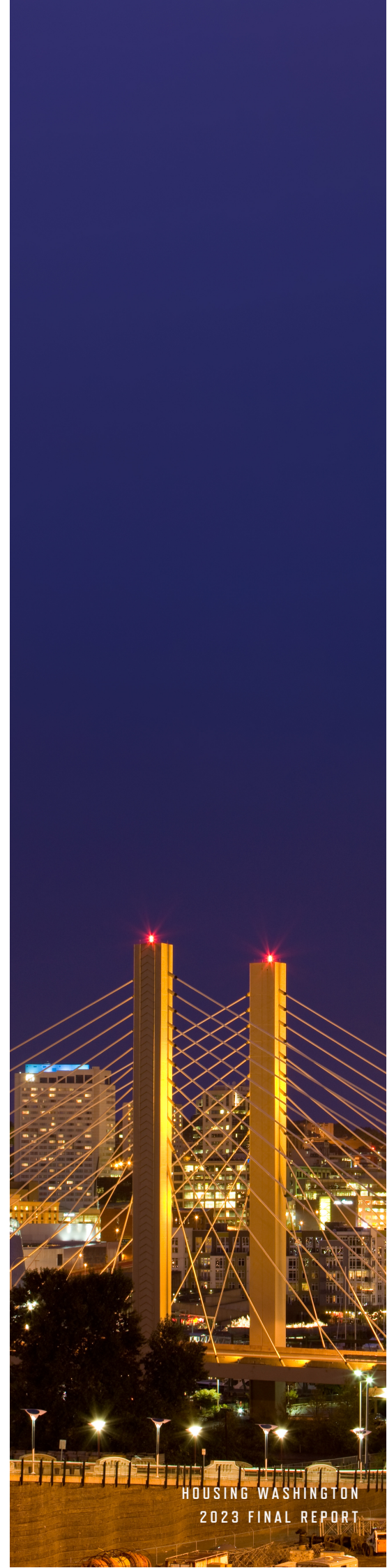
2023 SUMMARY

2023 saw Housing Washington back in full swing, complemented again by pre-and post-virtual events.

New ideas and concepts were tested, and expanded food and beverage offerings were provided, along with delivering enhancements such as live music during the receptions and a town square concept to the exhibit hall.

Successes to be celebrated

- An array of diverse and equitable series of sessions.
- Strong attendance by senior level, as well as young industry professionals, with 810+ attendees.
- Diverse audience both in age and race.
- Strong, well received plenary presenters.
- Well attended and sometimes overflowing sessions.
- Well attended pre-conference virtual lunches.
- Good attendance at post-conference Coffee with Friend of Housing awardees.
- Robust and lively Welcome Reception.
- Strong sponsorship participation exceeding our expectations, and nearly reaching pre-Covid support levels.
- Effective subcommittees that can be better managed in 2024 to transfer some burden off the teams and back to the facilitators.
- Tracks were successful, providing focus and driving attendance.
- The Whova app worked well and provided varied avenues of engagement among attendees.
- The new kiosk concept for exhibitors worked well, and further enhancements would continue to support exhibitor needs on-site.





The Housing Washington on-demand library continues to grow. Recordings for nearly all 2023 sessions have been added, continuing to fulfill the goal to grow Housing Washington as a key year-round resource for the affordable housing industry. The library is also another delivery channel for inclusive programming accessible by all and helps boost traffic to the Housing Washington website.

Areas to explore and discuss

- The Friend of Housing awards event was well-attended but the venue presented a major audio/visual challenge. Sound equipment did not live up to expectations and no solution was provided by the audio/visual tech team, and inherently attendees wished to continue networking despite a planned event. While moving to another room was explored, the feasibility of executing on a last-minute shift was challenging.
- The exhibit area, while dynamically presented to engage attendees at eye level, did not fully meet expectations. While the new format/layout did encourage a robust mix-and-mingle environment and provided fun elements (photo booth, chalk wall) for engagement, it was communicated by the presenters that the Town Square concept fell a bit flat in its concept. With some adjustments and early planning there may be opportunities to review the portions that worked for attendees and exhibiting sponsors and adjust the space accordingly to ensure a positive experience.
- Participation from Commerce on subcommittees was not as strong as in previous years, which contributed to significant delays in the planning and finalizing the overall conference program. Speaker suggestions from past attendees were also under used/reviewed by subcommittees.

The online platforms and app

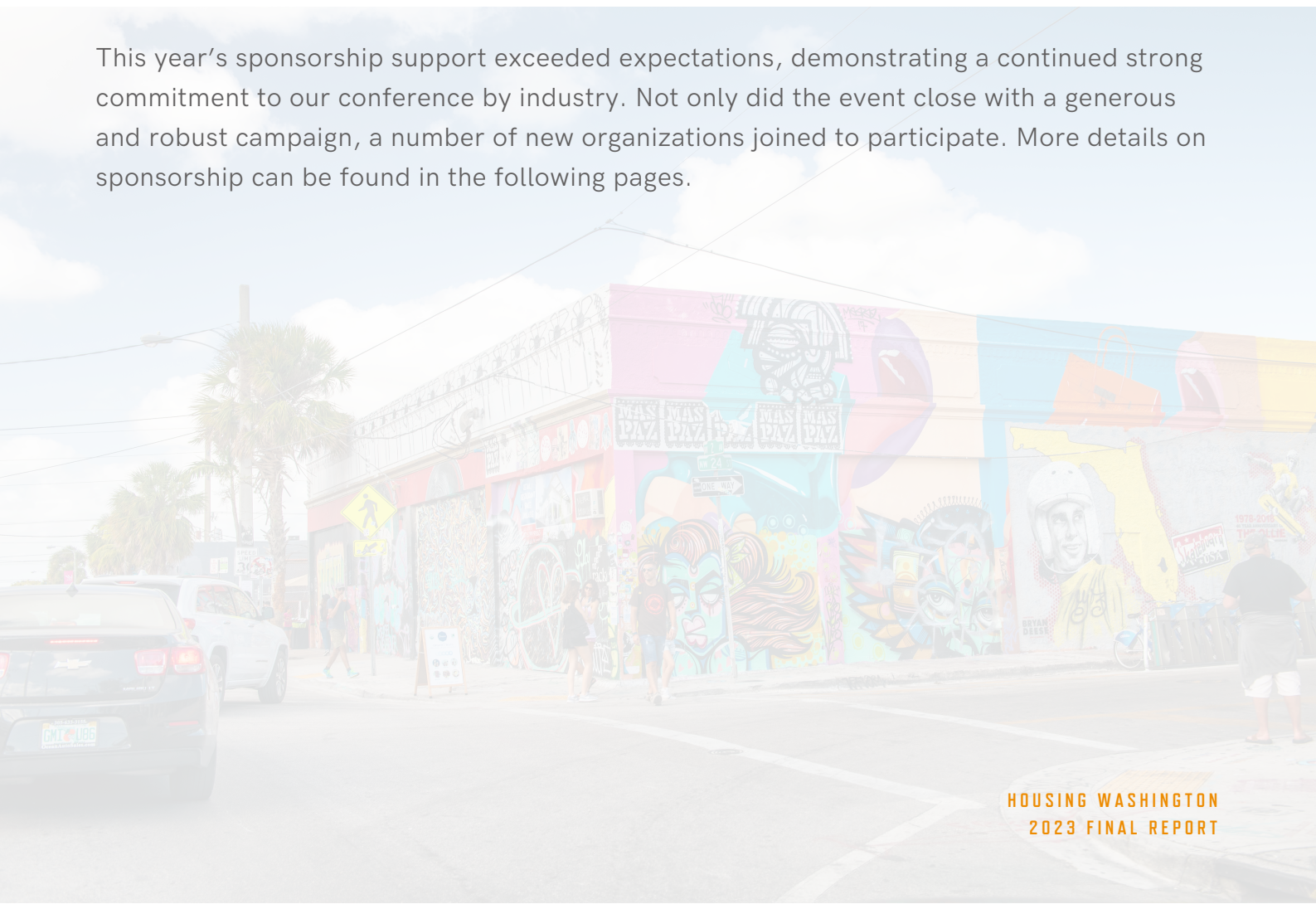
Housing Washington utilized Zoom as a virtual platform for pre-and post-virtual events, as well as live streaming. For the in-person event, the Whova app supported attendee engagement, connections, and delivery of conference information.

Zoom performed well without technical issues for the pre-and post-virtual events. Some lessons were also learned about our participants and the use of a virtual platform including possibly expanding use to replace Zoom. This would direct attendees to use the Whova app from registration, replacing Eventbrite, to post-conference push notifications. Overall, the Whova app was well received and utilized by attendees and would continue to be a recommended platform.

Our partnership and sponsorship support

Our coordinated partnership with the Washington State Low Income Housing Alliance's Conference to End Homelessness continued to draw attention to our conference, though it is clear from data collected that the joint promotional partnership is not driving high awareness of Housing Washington nor increased attendance to the event.

This year's sponsorship support exceeded expectations, demonstrating a continued strong commitment to our conference by industry. Not only did the event close with a generous and robust campaign, a number of new organizations joined to participate. More details on sponsorship can be found in the following pages.

Attendees Average Age Range

Participants ranged in age from 21 - 55 years old, with the largest percentage being 35- 45 years. The figures track similarly to 2022, however this year, participating young professionals represented nearly 23% of overall attendees.

Attendee Career Level

A broad range of varied career levels were represented in 2023. Professionals and mid-level management comprised the largest concentration of attendees.

REVENUES

At a final close of \$170k in funding, the 2023 conference realized a robust sponsorship campaign that was close to pre-pandemic support levels. Not only did efforts well surpass last year's campaign, they fell just under our highest achieving campaign from 2018, which garnered \$177k.

We achieved a 68% increase in our 2023 sponsorship support, which was inclusive of two additional sponsors to support an add-on Friend of Housing after party celebration.

We welcomed a total of 72 sponsoring organizations, which included 53 returning companies and 19 new organizations. This year we increased our foundational platinum level support to three organizations, two of which were new to the event.

The Washington State Department of Commerce also returned as a strong partner with its consistent annual \$25,000 contribution.

This year's event also experienced continual increases in costs to support new and regularly sustained amenities for participants, ultimately driving an overall net budget loss of just under \$200k.

Looking ahead to next year, a review of sponsorship, as well as registration fees, are strongly suggested to ensure continued sustained funding to support the event and build the reserve funds.

MARKETING

Strengthening the new graphic look for Housing Washington afforded us the opportunity to completely update the website and social media, as well as email newsletters and conference materials and signage.

We applied the graphics to all marketing materials, which provided a fresh look. Emails were delivered in concert to our Housing Washington email list, as well as the Commission email list, expanding the reach of each message. Strong engagement was seen in both the email open and click through rates.

Social media was limited to Facebook and X (formerly Twitter). Next year, we will add Instagram, LinkedIn, and strengthen our presence on X. Content on each of these platforms will enhance our reach and has the potential to broaden our exposure with industry members, particularly with a laser focus of housing professionals on LinkedIn.

To gain new followers, we recommend boosting posts and adding emails specific to our attendees and audience segments to encourage further interaction and interest.

Key conference marketing drivers continue to be targeted Conference emails and word-of-mouth mentions, followed by Washington State Housing Finance Commission publicity efforts. Together, these channels comprise more than 90% of the overall awareness builders for the event, with the conference website, and the Washington State Department of Commerce marketing remaining as subsequent drivers of the event.

BY THE NUMBERS



Housing Washington had a combined 911 social media followers on Facebook (520), Twitter (372), and LinkedIn (19). Based on feedback in our General Conference Survey, attendees continue to engage with social media, but less so with Twitter. Facebook remains the most popular, with LinkedIn and Instagram as the next most popular platforms used by attendees.


There are a total of 4761 active Housing Washington email subscribers.

The housingwa.org URL was the driver of the majority of website traffic, up 92% from 2022. Search engines Google, followed by Bing were the second and third most popular route of traffic, with 29% and 8% increases respectively.

 **94%** Of the overall website visits, 94% were new visitors to the site.




There were more than 3k US website visitors, which represent the majority of traffic to the Housing Washington website. A concentration of visitors were based in the Pacific Northwest, followed by the general West Coast and upper East Coast regions. A small number of views generated from various locations across the U.S. Globally, isolated views were from visitors in Australia, Philippines, India, and Canada.

The number of Housing Washington website sessions was more than 3k from January 2023 through mid-November 2023, representing an increase of 37% since 2022.

Q1 For you personally or for your organization, how important is it for Housing Washington to continue to offer some programming virtually and free of charge as part of the overall event?

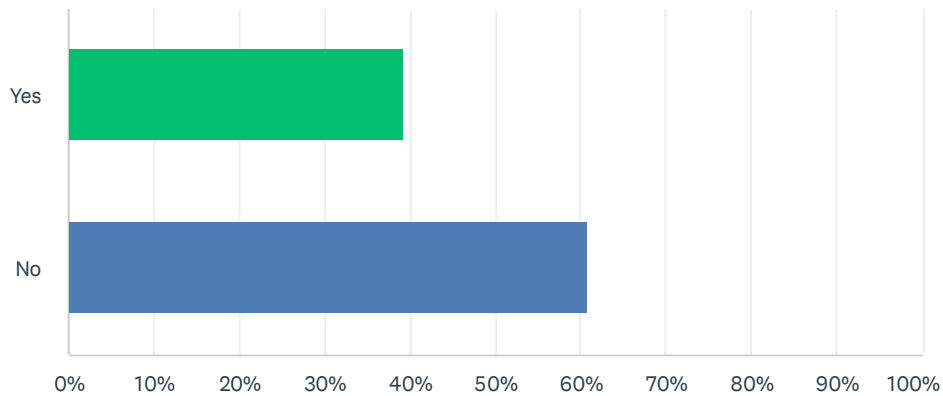

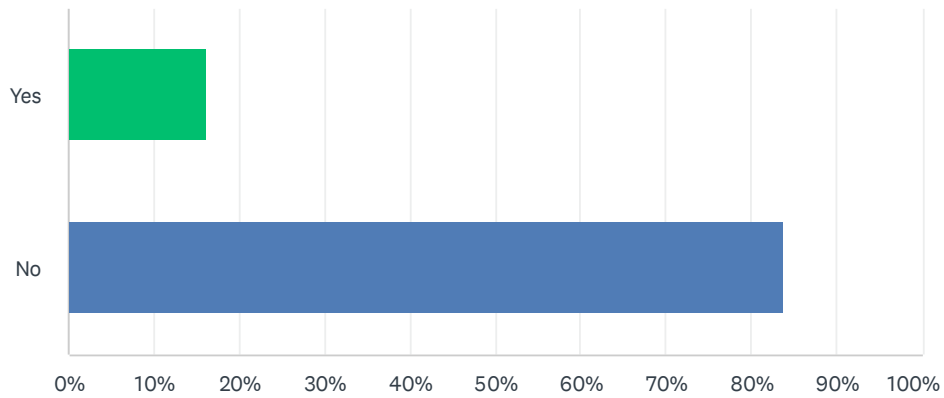

Q5 Are you following the Housing Washington Facebook page?

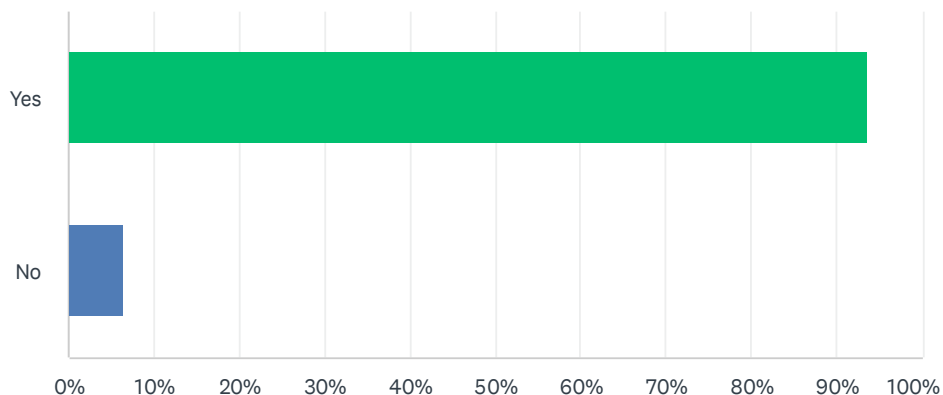

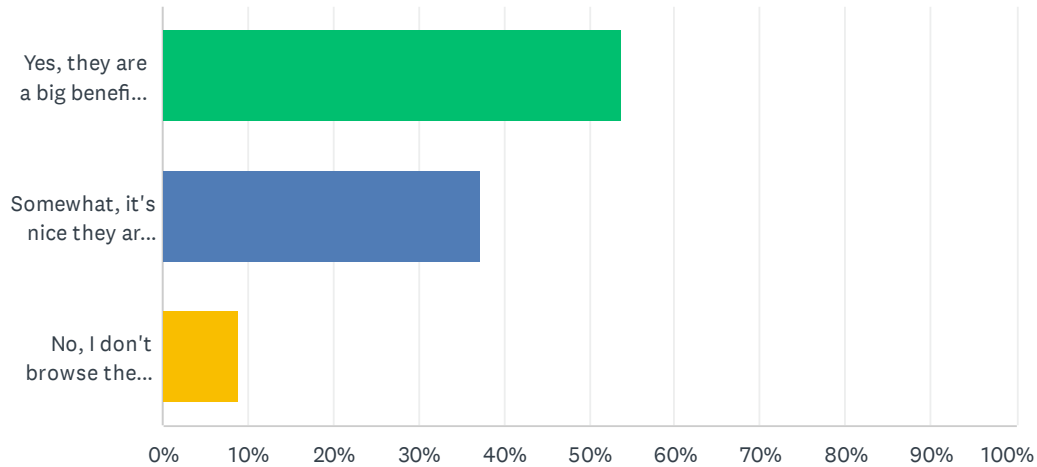

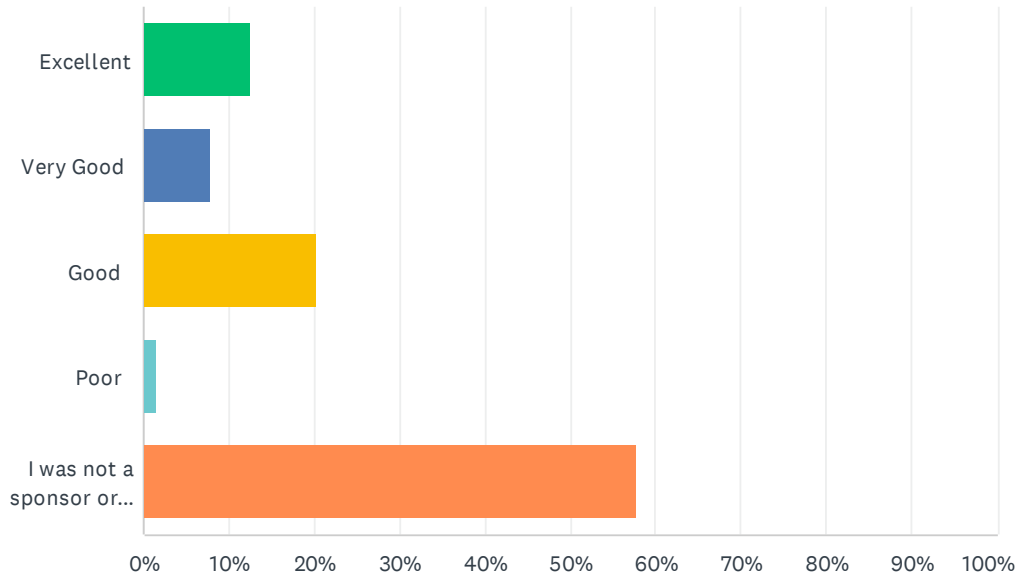

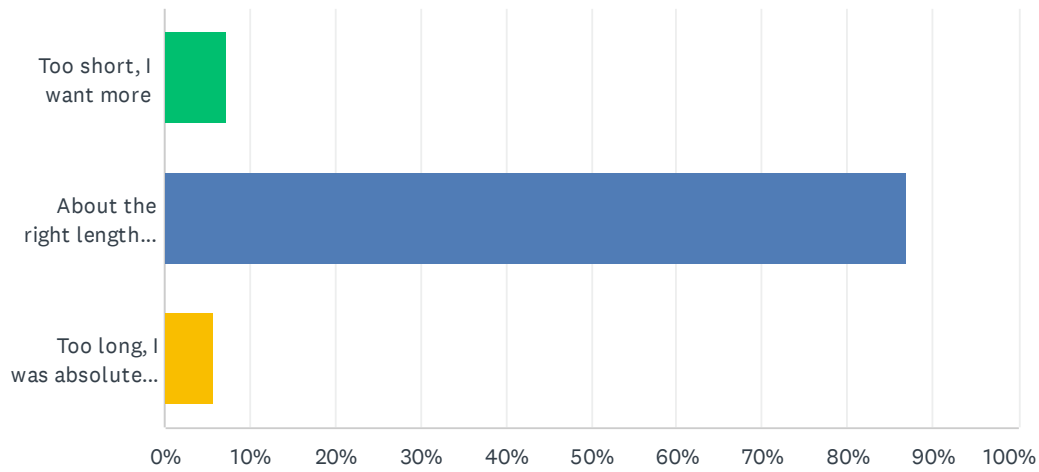

Q14 How do you find the length of the conference?

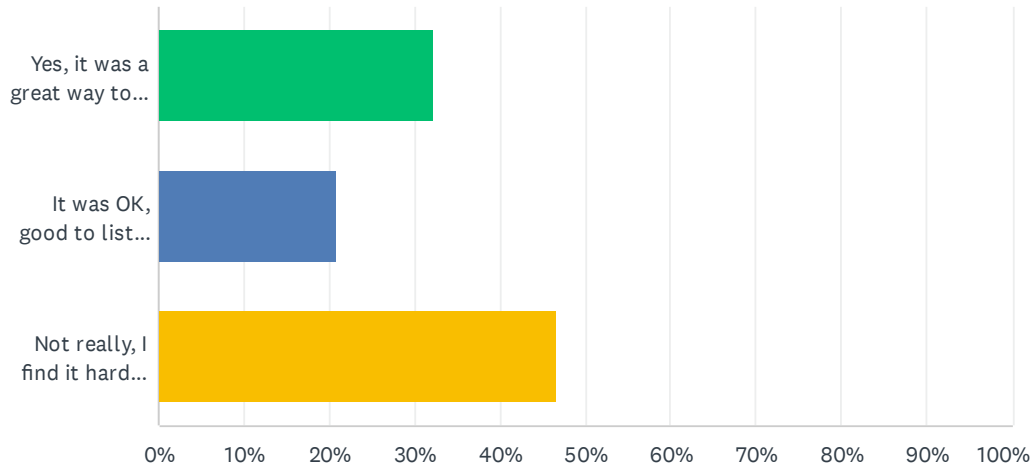

Q15 Do you find the virtual sessions of value?

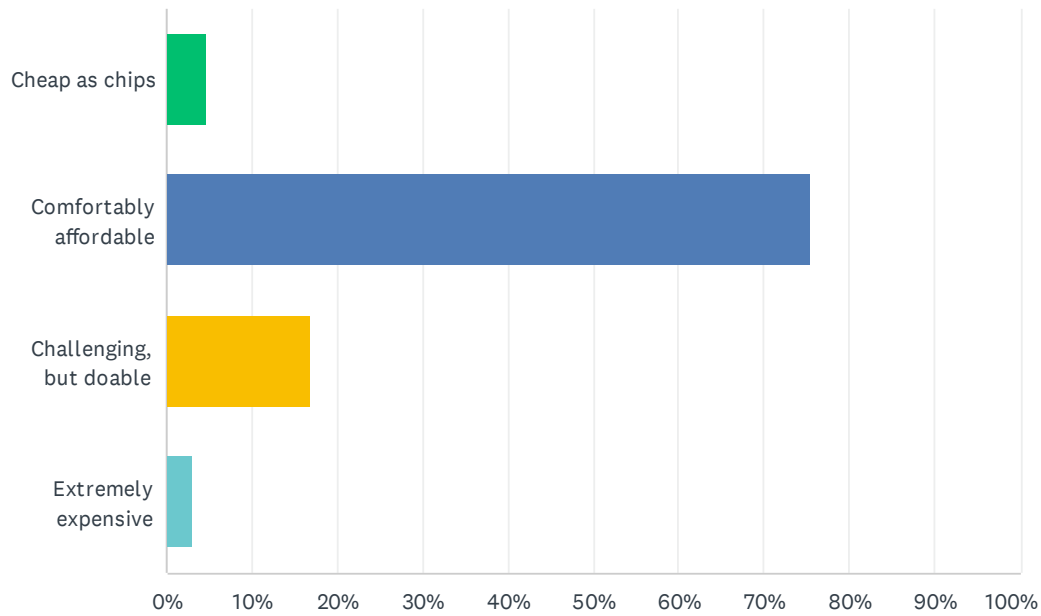

Q16 How do you rank the Housing Washington registration fees?

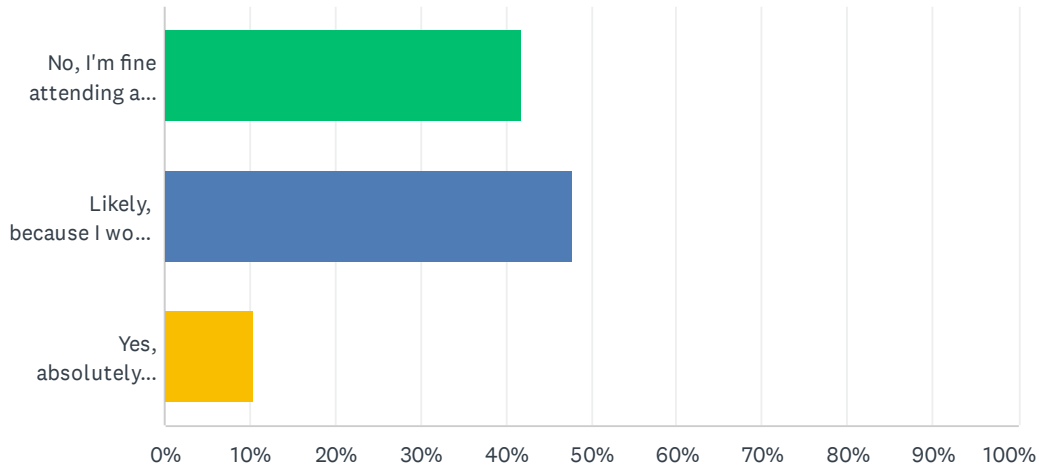
